Monday After breakfast in the Dining Room, tour guide Sherri Hudson will meet you in the Lobby at 8:30 to conduct a bus tour of the Stranleigh Manor House at Wildwood Metropark. The Manor House was part of the estate of Robert Stranahan, founder of Champi-



on Spark Plug and his wife, Page. They lived in the 30,000 square foot Georgian Colonial mansion until 1968. The Manor House was built toward the end of the Great Depression for just \$362,000. The house has 35 main rooms, 17 bathrooms and 16 fireplaces.



Next up is another gem of Toledo's Metroparks, Toledo Botanical Garden. The Garden has grown significantly from 20 acres in 1964 to over 60 acres today. 2015 celebrates 50 years of

enriching lives through gardens, the arts, and nature. A docent will be available to give a tour of some of the gardens and artists cottages. The Seasons Gift Shop has a wide variety of garden art and gift items.

Next we're off to the zoo. The Toledo Zoo is one of the world's most complete zoos and a top family destination.

First, we will be treated to lunch in the African Lodge followed by a tour of the newly renovated Aquarium that now houses 3000+ aquatic animals in 178,000 gallons of water. Here you will be able to touch a stingray with your own hands or stand beside a sea turtle as it glides by.



After our aquatic adventure, you will board the bus for our next stop where you will tour one of Toledo's most beautiful and historic churches, Our Lady of Most Holy Rosary Cathedral. Located in Toledo's Historic Old West End, this cathedral is designed in the Spanish **Plateresque** style and is a massive 285 feet long by 215 feet wide of vane-colored stone topped with a tile roof of oranges, purple-blues and greens. Inside are ornate carvings, murals and stained glass.



There is no better place to tell the story of how Toledo became the Glass City than the home of a glass industry pioneer located across from the Toledo Museum of Art Glass Pavilion.



Located in Toledo's Historic Old West End, this is the former home of glass industry pioneers Edward Drummond Libbey and Florence Scott Libbey. From the elegant first floor foyer to the beautiful dining room that includes hand-carved mahogany woodwork, to the wonderful solarium that faces the new Toledo Museum of Art Glass Pavilion, you can imagine how the Libbey's must have enjoyed their home.



Your coach will return to the hotel around 5:00 PM so you'll have time to change and join the Galvanizers at the exclusive **Toledo Club** for a memorable reception and dinner.

Tuesday Following breakfast in the Dining Room meet in the lobby and start the day with a short trip to the Gathered Art Gallery, a working glass hot shop and gallery in downtown Toledo. Here you will get the opportunity to get creative with glass as you work with the gallery staff to create your own glass flower.



Once finished with our glass pieces, we will board the bus for our next stop, The Toledo Museum of Art Glass Pavilion. Opened in 2006, the postmodern Glass Pavilion is home to the art museum's world-renowned glass collection, featuring more than 5,000 works of art from ancient to contemporary times. A knowledgeable docent will take you on a tour of this amazing glass collection followed by a glass blowing demonstration by resident artists.



Time for lunch! We will take a short ride to the Docks, home of Toledo's premier riverfront dining complex. We will be dining at Real Seafood Company where they serve up fresh seafood dishes daily.



Next is the "shop stop" for the day at the Libbey Glass Factory Outlet Store. Shop the largest selection of glassware, dinnerware & home décor products including stemware, tumblers, cocktails, mugs, plates, bowls, vases, candle accessories and much more.



The last stop on the tour will be a beer and chocolate tasting at Maumee Bay Brewing. Established in 1995 the Maumee Bay Brewing Co. operates out of the Historic Oliver House creating delightfully drinkable ales, lagers, porters and stouts. Sample craft beers from the Maumee Bay Brewing Company and chocolates creations from Petit Fours Patisserie.

After returning to the hotel we all will leave at 5:45 PM for a reception and dinner at the National Museum of the Great Lakes.
